Highlands Kids

Preschool

Designed specifically for children six-weeks-old through kindergarten, our Nursery/Preschool services are a place for our youngest generation to learn about the love of Christ.

During service, your child will engage in a thoughtfully-planned learning experience reinforced with songs, Bible stories, and activities.

Elementary

First-through-fifth grade children will have the opportunity to engage in dynamic worship and biblical teaching through our grade-specific learning model.

During service, children will spend most of their time in a Small Group to give them the benefit of a consistent Small Group Leader and interaction with kids their age.

Together, they'll learn about the Bible and how to have a relationship with God, memorize Scripture, and have fun developing friendships with one another.

Special Needs

Haven—our Highlands Kids special needs ministry—exists to share the love of Christ by assisting individuals and families needing special accommodations to become full participants and contributors in the body of Christ. With support available for both children and adults, we are committed to providing a safe and comfortable environment that allows all members access to worship, ministry, and fellowship with one another.

HIGHLANDS HAVEN SPECIAL NEEDS MINISTRY (Ages 2-11)

Our goal is to integrate children into an age-appropriate Highlands Kids experience with the right level of assistance.

Support in the Highlands Kids experiences takes place during specific service times, offered at designated campuses.

TEEN AND ADULT FRIENDSHIP GROUPS (Ages 12+)

This Small Group is available during a specific Sunday service time for individuals with intellectual disabilities. Friendship Group offers a time of fellowship, worship, Bible-based video content, social skills development, and hands-on crafting.

What to Expect

Check-In

To make your first visit as easy as possible, we have created both an online and in-person registration process for you and your family. During registration, we'll get to know things like how many children are in your family, what allergies your child(ren) may have, and the best way to contact you. Once you are registered and checked in, both you and your child(ren) will receive a set of stickers with a matching code, also known as a "security tag". On the tag, you will also find your child's corresponding room. This sticker is what you'll use to pick up your child after the service. If, for any reason, we need to reach you, you'll see your child's code on the screen in the Main Auditorium during the service.

Drop-Off/Pick-Up

Once your child(ren) are checked in and arrive at the room printed on their sticker, our leaders will be ready to greet your family and engage your child in an age-appropriate activity. At the end of the service, a team member will verify that your security tag code matches the code on your child's tag before he/she is released into your care. In the event of a lost sticker, we will use your driver's license as an alternative to the security tag to verify information and check out your child.

Safety

In Highlands Kids, we are committed to safety, and it is the heart of our children's ministry to make every effort to ensure the safety and well-being of every child.

With this in mind, we do not allow anyone into our classrooms without a corresponding security tag, and all team members serving in a Highlands Kids area go through a screening process before serving. All team members serving in Highlands Kids are background-checked and trained in safety and security protocols.

Once in our care, a child is not allowed to be picked up by anyone who does not have a sticker with the code that coincides with the one on his/her sticker. If a security tag has been lost, photo identification must be presented and matched with the guardian information on the registered account. If a need arises or you have any questions, please contact a staff member and they will be happy to assist you.



Small Groups and Learning Plan

In Highlands Kids Elementary services, your children will be taught grade-specific, biblical truths and practical lessons through a learning plan and collection of series topics throughout the year.

The learning plan for your child's specific grade level will be taught by their Small Group Leader. Each week in their Small Group, they will work together on learning objectives like memorizing Scripture and understanding biblical principles.

Series topics will be presented through a video Bible lesson, followed by an age-specific, guided discussion with their Small Group.



Learning Plan

Age-specific learning happens in Small Groups every week with a yearly focus for each grade. Your kids will learn about these topics through Small Group lessons, Scripture memorization, and biblical life-application.

In the following pages, you will find more detailed information on the yearly Small Group focus for each grade level, as well as the series topics and Bible lessons for the year.

First-Grade Small Group Focus: Identity

First-graders will grow in their personal identity by learning that they are created by God, loved by Him, and that Jesus wants to be their best friend.

Throughout the year, they will:

- Memorize 12 Bible verses
- · Learn about God as their Creator
- Learn the Gospel message using the Wordless Book
- Practice the Highlands Kids Values

Second-Grade Small Group Focus: Prayer & Worship

Second-graders will learn how to grow in their relationship with God through praying and worshipping Him.

Throughout the year, they will:

- Memorize 12 Bible verses
- Memorize The Lord's Prayer and apply it to their personal prayers
- · Learn about the Armor of God
- Learn about the 10 Commandments

Third-Grade Small Group Focus: Relationships

Third-graders will learn how to build positive relationships by focusing on the two greatest commandments: Loving God and loving people.

Throughout the year, they will:

- Memorize 12 Bible verses
- Study the Fruit of the Spirit
- · Study the Gifts of the Spirit
- Learn about Jesus' 12 disciples

Fourth-Grade Small Group Focus: God's Word

Fourth-graders will learn more about the Bible, how to appreciate the amazing gift of God's Word, and start to understand the authority that Scripture has in our lives.

Throughout the year, they will:

- Memorize 20 Bible verses
- · Memorize the books of the New Testament
- · Learn about the structure of the Bible
- Learn how to study and apply Scriptures

Fifth-Grade Small Group Focus: Leadership

Fifth-graders will explore their God-given purpose by learning about spiritual gifts and how to share the hope of Jesus with others.

Throughout the year, they will:

- Memorize 20 Bible verses
- · Memorize the books of the Old Testament
- Memorize the Apostles' Creed
- · Learn how to study and apply Scriptures





Throughout the year, your child(ren) will learn through a short, weekly video lesson. The video will teach on the current series topic by using relevant Bible stories. Your kid(s) will watch the video in their Small Group and then discuss what they're learning with their friends and Small Group Leader in an age-specific, guided discussion.

The topics repeat every three years to provide a well-rounded learning experience. By repeating topics, these lessons are reinforced through different Bible stories, and your kid(s) get the benefit of revisiting valuable principles as they grow.


